

STS. PETER & PAUL SCHOOL

The 2022-2023 school year is off to a great start! With 176 students enrolled in kindergarten through fifth grade and 64 students enrolled in Kinder Haus, our school has been busy growing and learning both academically and spiritually.

Students are learning more about the Eucharist by attending monthly adoration and learning the Anima Chisti prayer to recite after receiving Holy Communion. Students attend Mass twice a week this year. Fr. Betz celebrates Mass with us on Wednesdays and Fr. Andrew celebrates Mass with us on Fridays. We have enjoyed praying for and writing letters to our prayer partners as well as attending Prayer Partner Mass with them.

Students are using a new program called iReady, a formative assessment used to assess student learning in reading and math. These assessments produce data that our staff can use to serve each child and their learning needs and opportunities.

Our spiritual and academic opportunities only continue to grow from here! We are looking forward to a fun basket-ball season, the school spelling bee, the annual Advent program and much more as we finish out the first semester.







RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

This year we welcome 277 Religious Ed students and 39 Catechists in K-12! We have 2 Seminarians with us from St. Meinrad Seminary this year. Deacon Devereaux King and 3rd year seminarian Caleb Scherzinger. Deacon Devereaux is from the Diocese of the Bahamas and Caleb is from the Diocese of Evansville, Celestine, IN. Please welcome these gentlemen when you see them and thank them for helping us teach the faith to our children and parish family! This is also an opportunity for them to experience parish life and faith formation.

During the month of October we prayed a Living Rosary with all students, Deacon Devereux taught about adoration and students were able to spend time in prayer with the Blessed Sacrament. Mark Lutz and Emily Lutz led the students in beautiful song with the Litany of the Saints in honor of All Saints' Day. Fr. Gary & Fr. Andrew lead prayers for All Souls' Day for students. Classes placed lit votive candles on graves throughout the cemetery.

The Serra Club of Evansville hosts an annual essay program on vocations for 8th grade students. They were asked to write an essay, research paper, PowerPoint presentation, skit or poem describing their understanding of vocations after listening to talks by Matt & Amy Parmer on Marriage, Seminarian Caleb Scherzinger, Dcn. Devereaux King and Fr. Andrew on Priesthood/Holy Orders, and Sr. Irma on Religious Life.

SEMINARIAN

Clint Johnson

My name is Clint Johnson, and I'm one of our sixteen seminarians for the Diocese of Evansville. I'm in my second year of theology at St. Meinrad – the fourth year of six for me. I'm from Fort Branch and grew up attending Holy Cross Parish. My parents are Roger and Angie Johnson, and my sister and brother-in-law are Jamie and Jason Baehl. I went to Pre-K at Sts. Peter and Paul, K-5 at Holy Cross, 6-8 at Fort Branch Community, and high school at Gibson Southern. I went to Ball State University for four years and received a bachelor's in architecture. I then received a master's in architecture from Washington University in St. Louis. I worked in Evansville for one year while living at the newly opened House of Discernment at Sacred Heart in Evansville with Fr. Tyler Tenbarge and three other guys discerning their vocation. I decided to enter seminary at St. Meinrad and first did two years of philosophy and received a master's before



beginning the final four years of theology. If you're counting, that puts me in the 22nd grade.

I decided to first go into architecture because I loved to draw and paint but didn't want to do it full time. Architecture fit well with my creative and imaginative background. Model-building became my new favorite hobby in school. I started to become obsessed with doing projects over time but noticed that I was very isolated and wasn't thinking about the bigger picture. Faith has always been a part of my life, but it became the most important thing late in college. I was never truly happy unless I was with my friends at church. This was the first time that I thought about priesthood, and that thought stuck with me as I continued into graduate school. After I more actively discerned for a year, I still wasn't sure what I was called to, so I decided to give seminary a chance to see if it would pull me one way or the other. After completing philosophy at St. Meinrad, I agreed to go to Rome to study theology for four years. It was an experience unlike any other as you can imagine, but something felt off. I wasn't "at home" there and subconsciously was very nervous for ordination which seemed so much closer. I came back home after a semester and started working again with the intention of not going back, but, almost immediately, I felt a huge hole in my life that was only going to be filled by giving myself completely to God. I was certainly nervous to do this, and still am, but I have a greater trust after having done all this and believe that God will provide every step of the way, especially in the fearful moments. Since being back at St. Meinrad, I've felt great reassurance and peace about giving myself to the Church as a priest. Every morning is another decision to either avoid or enter into the uncertainty that comes with a vocation, but I've had great joy in saying yes to that call.

Hello! My name is Dylan Stefanich, and I am a first-year seminarian for the Diocese of Evans-ville. My home parish is Holy Cross Catholic Church in Fort Branch, IN, and I graduated from Gibson Southern High School in 2018. KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The Knights of Columbus was founded 140 years ago, and our local council has been present in the community for 103 years. The organization was founded on the principles of charity, unity, and fraternity by Father Michael J. McGivney in New Haven, Connecticut, and was originally designed to bring financial aid and assistance to the sick, disabled, and needy members and their families, which it still does today. Fr. McGivney was recently beatified and is on the path to canonization for sainthood.

Pope John Paul II once referred to the Knights of Columbus as "the strong right arm of the Church" for its support of the Church, the clergy, and the charitable works it does. Locally, the K of C has a vibrant council. As of September 28th, 2022, the local K of C council has donated more than \$35,000 to charitable causes, most of which have stayed here in our local communities. Some of the organizations are Right to Life of Gibson County, Gibault Children Services, Special Olympics, Project Rachel, Gibson County ARC, The Lord's Pantry, Ronald McDonald House, libraries in Haubstadt and Fort Branch, our local Catholic schools, Kairos Prison Ministries, Source & Summit, seminarians from Haubstadt & Fort Branch, & many others.

The only requirements to be a member of the Knights of Columbus are that you are a man of at least 18 years of age, a practicing Catholic, and in good standing with the church.

The Structure and Mission of St. Vincent de Paul Society

The society is a world-wide Catholic lay organization with the mission to help people in need. It is comprised of local groups referred to as conferences within the dioceses of the Church. Sts. Peter & Paul parish and Holy Cross parish are joined as one local conference group The group has members who attend monthly meetings to discuss the needs and how we can help those individuals that find themselves in unfortunate circumstances. One of the core mission elements of the group is to grow spiritually together to be able to see Christ in those we serve.

Who are we helping?

Most of our requests for help come from calls to our parish offices. From there the group goes into action to contact the person in need. Usually the individual or family needs help with utilities and/or rent. By meeting with them we can find out what their situation is and offer them any other resources of help that are available in addition to financial assistance.

Our St. Vincent de Paul conference group relies and operates on contributions to help those we serve. In addition to the core group that meets monthly, we also have contributing members that pay annual dues and some that make contributions on a regular basis. How To Go To Confession

Prepare to make a good confession by examining your conscience. You may use the examination at the bottom of the page.

Prayer Before Confession

Come Holy Spirit into my soul. Enlighten my mind that I may know the sins I ought to confess, and grant me your grace to confess them fully, humbly, and with a contrite heart. Help me to firmly resolve not to commit them again. O Blessed Virgin, Mother of my Redeemer, intercede for me through the Passion of Your Son, that I may obtain the grace to make a good confession. Amen.

Rite of Reconciliation

Priest: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Penitent: Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (how long?) since my last confession, and these are my sins: (confess your sins).

Priest: (gives you a penance)

Penitent: (Pray the Act of Contrition):


My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against You, whom I should love above all things. I firmly plan, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In His name, my God, have mercy. Amen

Priest: (gives you absolution for your sins)

Penitent: (recite or do your penance as soon as possible)

Examination of Conscience for a Good Confession

- I. I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD: YOU SHALL NOT HAVE STRANGE GODS BEFORE ME. Did I fail to love God, to make God first in my life, to thank Him, trust Him, love Him as He deserves? Did I fail to pray? Have I doubted or denied my faith? Was I careless in saying my prayers? Do I give God time everyday in prayer? Have I been involved in Ouija boards, Tarot cards, and the occult?
- **2. YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD IN VAIN.** Did I curse or swear? Did I use God's Name in vain, lightly, carelessly, by blasphemy? Have I used foul language or jokes?
- 3. **REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH.** Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation? Did I leave Mass early without a good reason? Did I receive Holy Communion in the state of serious sin? In any of my previous confessions, did I lie to or deliberately conceal something from the priest? Did I do unnecessary work on Sunday?
- **4. HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER.** Did I honor and obey my parents? Have I respected my brothers and sisters? Have I respected those with lawful authority, including teachers, bosses and civil authorities? Have I talked back? Did I fail to help at home or to spend time with my family?
- **5. YOU SHALL NOT KILL.** Did I give in to feelings of anger or jealousy? Did I keep hatred in my heart? Did I fight, give a bad example or cause scandal? Have I abused alcohol or drugs? Have I had or in any way permitted or encouraged abortion? Have I thought about suicide? Do I avoid gluttony?
- **6. YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY.** Did I consent to impure glances? Sinful touches? Was I immodest in dress or behavior? Did I look at pornography, impure books, magazines, or videos? Am I guilty of masturbation? Have I engaged in premarital sex, or adultery? Have I used artificial contraception such as pills or devices? Do I live chastely a ccording to my state in life (married, single, religious and ordained)? Do I avoid occasions of impurity?
- **7. YOU SHALL NOT STEAL.** Have I stolen what is not mine? What or how much? Did I return it or make up for what I have stolen? Have I cheated on tests, homework or taxes? Did I waste time at work? Have I avoided laziness, idleness?
- **8. YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.** Have I lied or gossiped? Have I talked about another behind his back? Do I always tell the truth? Am I sincere? Did I reveal secrets that should have been kept confidential? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my talk?
- **9. YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.** Have I consented to impure thoughts? Have I encouraged them by stares, curiosity or impure conversations? Did I neglect to control my imagination or desire other people?
- **I0. YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.** Is my heart greedy? Am I jealous of what another has? Am I envious of others because I don't have what they have? Am I moody or gloomy? Do I work, study, and keep busy to counter idle thoughts? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others? Is my heart set on earthly possessions or on the treasures of Heaven?
